Curriculum News

Nursery

This half term, the Gingerbread Man has been causing trouble in Nursery! The Gingerbread Man ran away from Mr and Mrs Baker and ended up at St Charles'! After creating a terrible mess in the nursery classroom, he continued to run away so the children were left with the task of catching him and sending him back home! They created wanted posters, interviewed story characters and followed clues until they finally caught up with him! Reception





Reception have been learning about famous inventors. They have enjoyed learning about Alexander Graham Bell and his invention, the telephone. In class, they had fun looking at and exploring a range of phones from the past. They discussed how phones have changed over time and how they are different to the phones we use today. The children then became inventors and created telephones using paper cups, paper clips and string. With a friend, they tested their invention to see if it worked. It was very exciting! The children are looking forward to learning about another famous inventor, George Stephenson.

Year 1



This half term Year 1 have enjoyed learning about Significant Women in History, looking closely at Victorian nurses. We have looked at the similarities and differences of past and present hospitals, they have really enjoyed looking at lots of photographs. One nurse the children have learnt about is Florence Nightingale; they had lots of fun making a timeline of her life to see all of her accomplishments and why she was so significant.

Year 2








Year 3



Throughout the term, Year 3 have delved into the world of digital photography. Our budding photographers have been honing their composition skills, discovering the art of framing creative shots. They have explored various techniques to create visually striking images, learning to edit and enhance their photographs using digital tools. Moreover, our creative learners have also developed their critical thinking abilities by evaluating the skills they have used, reflecting on the impact of their choices.

Year 3 have also enjoyed a visit from That History Bloke as part of their Ancient Egypt topic this term.






Year 4

This half term Year 4 had an amazing time exploring sheep organs as part of last term's Science topic on Humans and Other Animals. It was fascinating to see the inside of a real organ including the muscles and blood vessels. We all enjoyed confidently, enthusiastically and safely exploring the organs in what was an unforgettable lesson!





Year 5



Year 5 have enjoyed learning about why the Early Islamic Civilisation was a significant turning point in History this half term. It is a subject that most of the children had very little prior knowledge about, so they have found it fascinating!

Year 6

This half-term, Year 6 have been learning about Pentecost in RE. The children produced some beautiful spiritual art and chose from the selection of Scripture quotes as inspiration to create an abstract piece relating to being witnesses to the Holy Spirit. Throughout the topic, the children have learnt what it means to be a witness and have recounted the Ascension of Jesus from different perspectives. The children have also developed an understanding of the life and work of key figures in the history of the People of God and have written biographies with key facts about St Stephen showing understanding of why he is significant in Christian history.

In Science this half-term, Year 6 have been developing their understanding of, 'Animals Including Humans.' Within this topic the children have built upon their understanding of the human skeleton and muscular system; described the functions of the human digestive system; described the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood and have been working as Scientists when dissecting hearts to identify key parts. The children considered why dissections take place and were able to draw conclusions based on their scientific enquiry.







Art - BBCET

This half term, all year groups have been involved in the first Bishop Bewick Art Project. The theme of the project was 'Stronger Together' and after learning all about our Trust and the values it upholds, we worked in phases to create spectacular pieces of artwork which represented strength and unity. The end products have spectacular and include digital photography, painting and collage work. Our artwork is going to be displayed in the Discovery Museum from June 8 until June 10.



English – trips

This week Year 5 and Year 6 children have visited the Live Theatre to take part in creative writing workshops. They enjoyed the visits and Year 4 are looking forward to their workshop after half term.

PE - Sport Update

It has been another busy half term for PE at St Charles'. Year 3 enjoyed an afternoon out for some skipping coaching and the Gosforth Catholic Cup competition has been hotting up, with football, cross country and netball competitions. The cross country was a particularly exciting contest, with our KS2 team winning overall by only one point!

We have had Key Stage 1 Healthy Active Lifestyle this term. The children really enjoyed the fun challenges. We love to get moving!

It has been lovely to welcome so many of you into school to join each class for their child led liturgical prayer to end their RE units. The children have planned these acts of worships themselves.




The children are really enjoying creative prayer this year. They have all thought about how they can make a difference by living out our Monday missions.
