Payment for School Meals (ParentPay)

Please note that your ParentPay account should not be in arrears. Please ensure there are sufficient funds on your account to cover the meals taken. Nursery meals are £2.10 per day and KS2 meals are £2.20 per day (£11 per week). Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive Universal Infant Free School meals and no payment is required.

School Car Park

Please remember to use the drop off point when dropping children off in the school car park. Not using the drop off point results in the car parking bays being blocked by vehicles and results in queues of cars which, in turn, results in children being late to school and parents being late for work. Please be mindful of our school parking charter and remember that the Regent Chapel car park can be used if the school car park is full. Thank you for your cooperation.

Access to Play Equipment at Start and End of School Day

Reminder that children and parent/carers should leave school yard immediately at the end of the school day. The play equipment in yard should not be used before or after school. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Food Items Containing Nuts

Please ensure your child does not bring any food items into school which contain nuts (such as Nutella sandwiches). We have children in school with severe nut allergies.

Naming Clothing

Please ensure you label your child's school belongings as this helps us identify any lost property which can then be returned to its rightful owner. Any belongings found without any names are put into a lost property box which will be available in the school yard at the end of each half term. Any lost property not claimed at the end of each half term will be disposed of responsibly.
