Reading Records

Our long-term aim is for all children to love and develop a passion for reading. You can help your child to achieve their full potential by listening to them read daily (for approximately 5 or 10 minutes), reading regular bedtime stories and by encouraging them to enjoy reading and sharing books together. Reading widely through all of these approaches will help develop your child's vocabulary, which in turn will make them more confident when reading more challenging books.

To help us track how much reading your child is taking part in, it is important that you sign their reading record for every day you have listened to them read, along with a brief comment if possible.

In Key Stage 2, when children are more likely to be reading with confidence and fluency, they should be keeping their own daily records, which should be **signed by** parents/carers at least once a week.

Our reading incentive scheme 'Reading Ninjas' is used to encourage children to read as much as possible. Your child will move their Ninja up the Ninja chart to earn their certificate to become 'The Grand Master' which will be a total of 200 reading entries
